INVESTING IN HOUSING FOR HEALTH

Addressing housing issues in the community

Lack of access to safe, affordable housing is pervasive across communities in the US. The impact of housing on health across conditions and populations spans chronic disease, injuries, nutrition and childhood development.

Health systems along with their community partners can make meaningful investments to alleviate housing issues...



COVID-19 IMPACT

The pandemic has sharply increased housing instability, with 40 million people at risk of eviction. The result is greater avoidable acute care utilization by vulnerable populations.



Every day, hospitals see the clinical manifestations of unmet housing needs in their

EDs. The recurring patient population comprises 5% to 10% of the overall patient population, yet accounts for half of health care costs. Approximately 30% of this group is homeless.

ASSESS COMMUNITY NEED

Ask: Who needs housing? Even when the housing needs between two communities appear similar, the root causes may be different.

Ask: What resources exist today? It could be that people are unaware of available resources.

DEFINE PROGRAM GOALS AND RESOURCES

Goals may be focused on clinical outcomes for discrete populations or can be community-centric. A mix of process and outcomes goals, as well as short- and long-term goals, is recommended.

GAIN INTERNAL BUY-IN

Internal champions of a program, especially physician champions, are key in the early stages of a program's development and implementation.



Local partners are experts on the community's needs and can provide necessary insights and resources to a health system's program. Remember, the most important partner is the community itself; engaging community members is key.
